What is the Liturgy?

- Original meaning: public work / work on behalf of people
- Vatican II: an exercise (act) of the priestly office of Jesus Christ
- In one word: worship
- More specifically: the official worship of the Church
- Unfolded: the worship which the whole Christ offers to the Father through the Holy Spirit
- Explained
- Instances of Liturgy: (1) Sacraments, (2) Liturgy of the Hours, (3) Sacramentals

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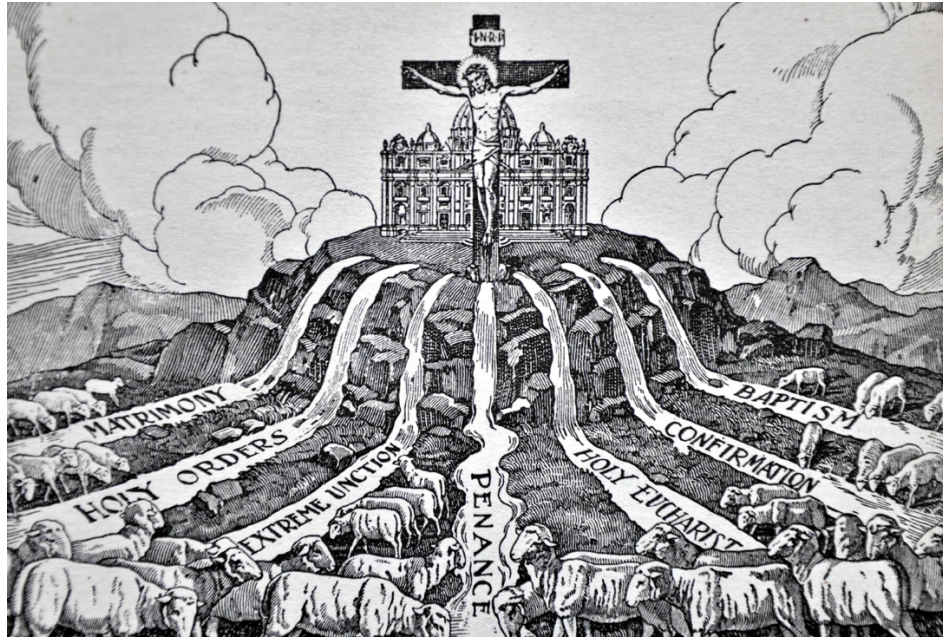
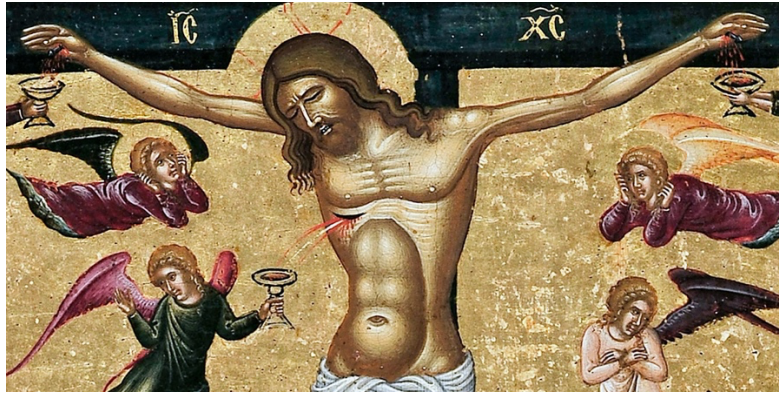
- *Catechism of the Catholic Church* paragraph numbers 1066-1067; 1076; 1085; 1115; 1670
